CLOTHING COLLECTION DRIVE CHECKLIST!

All you need to make it the best collection day yet!

Before the Collection

Choose a date in March or April

Select a suitable day for pupils, parents and guardians to bring in their clean, bagged clothing donations.

Confirm your collection

Book your collection with the Roberts Recycling team for the same day, or shortly after your chosen date, to avoid bags taking up space on site.

Promote your clothing collection drive

Use the templates included in this pack to spread the word. Print posters and display them in Reception or around the school.

Share the digital versions via newsletters, parent communications such as classdojo, community groups or your school / PTA social media page.

In the Classroom

Plan your lesson

Schedule time with your students to complete the classroom activities. Engage students to see how they can get involved. You may want to run through it with your eco club or school council.

Capture the moment

Capture photos of your groups getting involved in the activities or collection day (in line with your school's media consent permissions).

On Collection Day

Receive donations

Ask pupils to bring in clean, bagged clothing and store it safely in your agreed area.

Prepare for collection

Contact the Roberts Recycling team to confirm you are ready for collection.

Shirts, Trousers, Shorts, Tops, Jackets, Jeans, Jumpers, Hoodies, Polos, Joggers, gloves, clean underwear, skirts, dresses, vest tops, jewellery, swimwear, Paired shoes, trainers, boots, Handbags, belts, ties and accessories, Bedding and towels, Teddies and soft toys in good, complete condition (no hard toys), New clothes, with tags

Items we can't accept:

Ripped / stained / heavily worn, Socks, Dirty underwear, Bath robes, Slippers, Workwear, Pyjamas, Duvets, pillows or throws, Furniture or bulky items, Electrical items or appliances, School or work uniforms, Broken or incomplete toys, Used or opened cosmetics, Old fashioned

Please check wardrobes and drawers for items you no longer need, bag them up and bring them to the collection point on the day.
